Survey Results

Thanks very much to all of you who completed the survey for us. Over half of you took the opportunity to provide us with feedback. This is spectacular (most surveys get around 10%) and we are very grateful for the responses (of course you are welcome to get in touch with us at any time).

Key Findings:

Firstly, you were very happy with the service being provided to you by our service managers and team in the office (85% – 90% consistently selecting).

While ratings were high, there is still some work to be done around explaining the MDM reports. Not all of the respondents felt comfortable that they were getting the best out of the reports and this is an area we will be focusing on. The MDM system is designed to provide incentives for heifer growth. If you don't understand the incentives you are not going to be able to gain the advantages lan refers to.
